- Repairing and maintaining fences, corrals, water systems, and barns
- Maintain cleanliness of the barn, stock trailer, trucks, and other large equipment
- Occasional assistance at the Proctor Farmers Market

- Be able to lift, push, or pull up to 75 pounds
- Must be able to work in all weather conditions
- Must like doing a variety of tasks in a fast-paced environment
